

Latest News & Information:

Chancellor's statement on Medium-Term Fiscal Plan Measures

Earlier this week the Chancellor announced a reversal of the majority of tax measures set out in the Growth Plan. The following tax policies will no longer be taken forward:

- Cutting the basic rate of income tax to 19% from April 2023. The basic rate of income tax will therefore remain at 20% indefinitely.
- Cutting dividends tax by 1.25 percentage points from April 2023. The 1.25 percentage points increase, which took effect in April 2022, will now remain in place.
- Repealing the 2017 and 2021 reforms to the off-payroll working rules (also known as IR35) from April 2023. The reforms will now remain in place.
- Introducing a new VAT-free shopping scheme for non-UK visitors to Great Britain.
- Freezing alcohol duty rates from 1 February 2023 for a year. The next steps of the Alcohol Duty Review announced in Growth Plan 2022 will continue as planned. The alcohol duty uprating decision and interactions with the wider reforms to alcohol duties under the Alcohol Duty Review will be considered in due course.

This follows on from the previously announced decisions not to proceed with the Growth Plan proposals to remove the additional rate of income tax and to cancel the planned increase in the corporation tax rate. For further information, click <u>here</u>.

Working Wardrobe. Can you help local residents to look their best in preparation for an interview?

Working Wardrobe, is an initiative between Trafford Council, Groundwork and Trafford Housing Trust. It is a service primarily for people who are unemployed or on a training course in Trafford, Greater Manchester. It is designed for people who have a confirmed job interview for a paid position or an apprenticeship. Appointments with Working Wardrobe can only be made through a referral partner. Working Wardrobe clients receive a one-to-one appointment with one of our team and a tailored outfit for their upcoming interview. Help with Energy Bills for Businesses - Energy Bill Relief Scheme

The Government's Energy Bill Relief Scheme (EBRS) will cut energy prices for nondomestic energy customers such as businesses and charities. The scheme will apply to fixed contracts agreed on or after 1.4.22 as well as to variable and flexible tariffs and contracts. Discounts will apply to energy usage initially between 1.10.22 and 31.3.23. No action is needed to access the scheme - suppliers will automatically apply the EBRS discount to the energy bill. From 1 November 2022, VAT-registered businesses must use Making Tax Digital (MTD) compatible software for their VAT returns. Businesses that file their VAT returns on a quarterly or monthly basis will no longer be able to submit them using their existing VAT online account, unless HMRC has agreed they are exempt from MTD. I know how much the cost of living is worrying so many of you especially as the weather gets colder. Here at Trafford, we are working closely with our partners to see what support and help we can provide residents and businesses.

While we can't pay people's bills, we are looking to help in a number of ways. A project group has been set up to coordinate support for people in the borough. It involves working with a range of partners including the Community Hubs, Citizens Advice Bureau and housing providers. We are looking at various things, including providing places where people can go to a free, safe, warm and comfortable space over the autumn and winter.

We will also be signposting people to where they can receive help and advice with their bills, and we will be communicating the support available over the coming weeks and months.

Financial challenges

While I know money is tight for many of you and business owners, we are also facing our own financial challenges at the Council. The effects of Covid and rising inflation mean it is becoming even more difficult to balance the books and provide the much needed services so many people rely on.

We are also planning to lobby for a fairer financial settlement. The way the government calculates the money it gives councils uses a formula which is outdated and unfair on Trafford. It means we receive the lowest grant per person out of all the other local councils in Greater Manchester and miss out on millions of pounds. That is something we want to change.



However, I have to be honest and fear some of the rhetoric from the new Prime Minster and her cabinet. We have seen their disastrous so called mini-budget which has been widely condemned as being irresponsible. I am worried councils like ours will be become scapegoats and we will be targeted for cuts in public spending to help the government deliver on its promised tax cuts.

Sporting excellence

On a more positive note, Trafford remains one of the country's top sporting places as it will play host to the delayed Rugby League World Cup 2021 final in November. And thousands will also take part in the Manchester Half Marathon this Sunday. Good luck to everyone in the race which starts and finishes in Trafford.

Paying respects to the Queen

Finally, I must mention my sadness at the death of her Majesty the Queen. She has been the monarch for most people's lives and it is a strange feeling knowing that she is no longer with us. We had events in the borough to mark her reign during the period of mourning and I would like to thank all my colleagues at the Council who helped organise these fitting tributes. We have a new monarch and I wish King Charles III all the best in his new role.

This year the BID is working with Kids of Cheshire to host a Santa's Grotto over the weekends of Saturday 3rd & Sunday 4th December and Saturday 10th & Sunday 11th December. The Grotto will be at 104 George Street and will help to support the footfall in this part of the town in the run up to Christmas.



The BID will be working with The Music Place and Kings Court businesses on this festive family friendly event which will take place on Tuesday 13th December.



This year's Lantern Parade takes place on Saturday 19th November. The parade will gather in Goose Green and set-off at 4.45pm. The route has been extended to allow more spectators to watch the parade from vantage points around the town and to ease congestion in the Stamford Quarter at the end. The route includes Denmark Street, Moss Lane, Stamford New Road, Regent Road, Market Street, Shaw's Road and the Stamford Quarter.

There will be a stage in Stamford Square (Not So Secret Garden) throughout the day with local school and choir performances. There will be a festive singalong with the Music Place at 5.30pm as the parade arrives.

The BID will be running lantern workshops with five local schools prior to the day, the children who take part in the workshops will join the parade with their families. There will also be community lantern making workshops on the day bringing lots more families into the town.

Altrincham Bid

Altrincham Bid have been entered into a national BID competition as a result of their highly successful 'Trooping the Corgis' this summer

As part of the Queen's Platinum Jubilee Celebrations, Many White and the Bid team worked with Inch Arts, a community arts organisation based in the town, to produce Altrincham's largest town-wide art event, 'Trooping the Corgis'. The parading troop of fifty life-sized corgi sculptures were on guard throughout June and were displayed in the windows and foyers of shops and businesses around the town making the exhibition accessible to everyone. An auction was held at the end of June and an amazing £32,000 was raised in total.

Described by an industry expert as 'a community arts project showcasing the best in partnership working', the project involved artists, schools, and community groups. Contributions were made by Britain's best loved punk poet Dr John Cooper Clarke, Russ Meehan aka Qubek best known for his Mancunian Bees murals, Trevor Johnson who created the designs for the legendary Hacienda nightclub and Factory Records, and internationally acclaimed contemporary textile and fibre artist Alice Kettle.

- 50 life-sized Corgis decorated by artists, schools & community groups
- Displayed throughout June in 50 businesses around the town
- Auctioned at the end of the project to raise funds for community arts projects & to support the artists involved
- Headline sponsor plus 50 business hosts/sponsors

- to support the footfall and dwell time over the Jubilee weekend
- to encourage a broad demographic of visitors to explore the town and discover new businesses
- to highlight the town's cultural offer, raise the profile of and support local artists and community groups

'Trooping the Corgis' exceeded expectations at every stage – from the level interest shown by artists, schools, community groups and businesses, to the phenomenal number of media enquiries, the popularity of the trail itself and the demand for places at the auction. It was particularly gratifying to see so many people exploring the town with Corgi trail sheets and spending time in Altrincham. The event gave a real focal point to the town's celebrations, bringing the community together.


